Every student upon enrollment is given the TSI (Texas Success Initiative) on the first day. The Texas Success Initiative Assessment, better known as the TSI test, is a program which determines the appropriate level of college course work for an incoming student. The TSI test consists of three separate exams: Mathematics, Reading, and Writing.

This assessment is a series of questions that help predict what classes are best suited for student needs. All college students in Texas will complete this test unless they meet exemption criteria.

The purpose of the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) is to determine if students are ready for college-level work in the areas of reading, writing and math. Success in these areas can help students complete their college degree or certificate program.
